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
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Peace Mom Purchases Property Near Crawford

CRAWFORD — In preparation of what is gearing up to be the second Vigil, anti-war peace mom Cindy Sheehan has purchased property in Crawford and plans to locate Camp Casey on the site. This new location will be the third temporary residence of the peace protestors in President Bush's hometown.

Acting as an agent for Sheehan, New Orleans native Gerald Fonseca purchased the five plus acres from longtime Crawford resident Bobby Ramsey. Disputing claims of misrepresentation, Fonseca said that the only information that he did not provide the land owner was that Camp Casey would be located on the prop-

According to Fonseca, when Ramsey found out what the land was to be used for, he refused right-of-way easement for powerline installation.

Adding to the difficulties, Fonseca said that three out of four gravel companies refused to work on the site. They did finally find someone to build the road for the property and have begun the construction.

Plans currently are to have power and water installed before Sheehan's arrival in August.

Sheehan said that she is planning to be in Crawford on Aug. 12, three days before the President is set to leave the town.

Reporting that the idea behind the purchase is to accommodate the growing size of the 'family" that has joined Sheehan in her anti-war activism, she said that when there is no longer a need for them to be in Crawford that the hope was to donate the land to the City in order to construct a park and playground called Specialist

mented that the new location would remove the protestors from the current location on the property of Mark Mattlage.

Mattlage offered the one-acre site that became known as Camp Casey II following the enactment of ordinances prohibiting the camping in ditches surrounding the President's

Though the move closer to Bush's ranch took protestors off of the road and out of the ditch of Camp Casey I, there was still the problem of traffic.

Officials said that this relocation should help relieve that.

Fonseca reported that work is continuing on infrastructure and though nothing bad has happened yet, nothing good has happened either.

We do understand that some of the neighbors don't want us here," said Fonseca. "We still plan to be good neighbors."

Sheehan said, "Our ultimate goal is to make Camp Casey obsolete. Until then, we'll be in Crawford."

Anti-Choice Groups Buying, Closing Abortion Clinics

WICHITA, Kan. — An anti-choice website reported recently that buildings that house abortion clinics in the South and Midwest are being purchased and then closed by anti-

According to the article on LifeNews.com, a Tennessee abortion business lost a bid to own a facility to the Pro-Life Majority Coalition in Chattanooga, Tenn.

Once purchased, the building was turned into "a memorial for all of the babies who died at the abortion center over the years."

The article goes on to say that more abortion clinics using the same method have been shut down in Kansas, Nebraska, and Florida.

This method, however, is nothing new, and pro-choice advocates have caught on.

Anti-choice activists attempted to buy a building that housed an abortion business in Omaha, Nebr. in 2000, but the business owner won a lawsuit, kept the facility open, and then started a fund to give loans to clinics that want to purchase their own property.

Mexican Judges To Rule On Presidential Race Dispute Sept. 6

MEXICO CITY — Over the County Commissioners com- next four weeks, Mexico's Federal Electoral Tribunal will plow through 364 complaints lodged by parties disputing the results of the extremely close presidential race there.

The ruling of the seven judges set for Sept. 6 is expected to decide the political battle between the businessbacked Felipe Calderon and the populist Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador, who lost the official election by less than a percent of the vote.

Law experts agree that since the credentials of the judges are near perfect, and they each earn roughly \$415,000 a year, they will be hard to sway.

However, the job that lay ahead of them is tough. In the process, the judges' choices are three-fold: declare a winner, order a recount, or annul the vote - the latter of which would leave Mexico without a president for over a year.

Experts also say that such an annulment is highly unlikely since national and international electoral officials and observers



noted that the July 2 election was free from most corruption, loses.

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
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Exclusive Interview With

Dr. Morgan Reynolds,

Member of Scholars for 9/11 Truth

DALLAS — Dr. Morgan Reynolds is a penny-pinching, free market, small government Republican. As the former Chief Economist for the United States Department of Labor from 2001-2002, he enjoyed a lifestyle much easier than many in the United States, having been appointed to the position by the well-oiled Bush team. Currently professor emeritus with Texas A&M University, Reynolds spends nearly all of his off-time fomenting a New American Revolution.

Unlike his former government colleagues, Reynolds does not believe the official line on Sept. 11, 2001. On Saturday, July 22, in partnership with the Dallas Air America Radio group, the Lakewood Theater in North Dallas devoted a special free screening to Loose Change: Second Edition and 9/ 11 Revisited. Reynolds was on hand to lecture the audience between films, and to give them several parting thoughts at the end of the evening. Loose Change played in front of a nearly packed house; about half we have compelling evidence

end of Revisited. Both films are available online, free of charge. See further reading at the end of this writing.

The Lone \widecheck{Star} Iconoclast was on-hand to watch both films and sit down with Dr. Reynolds after he spoke.

ICONOCLAST: Thank you for taking the time to speak with us, Dr. Reynolds. You are currently professor emeritus with Texas A&M, correct?

DR. MORGAN REYNOLDS: Yes, I've taught there for 28 years. And in 2001-2002, I was the Chief Economist Department of Labor, a political appointee of the Bush/Cheney Administration. I was also the director of the Criminal Justice Center at the National Center for Policy Analysis, which is headquartered in Dallas, Texas.

ICONOCLAST: So, short version ... 9/11 was an 'Inside Job.' You lean more toward the side that says the Bush Administration made it happen, rather than those who think they simply allowed it to happen.

DR. REYNÖLDS: Yes. I think

the crowd remained through the that 9/11 was done by elements of the Bush/Cheney government, aided by select outsiders. They did it. It doesn't have anything to do with Arabs or caves in Afghanistan. It was all set up to aid the war on terror, control, oil, promote the global domination project and the like ...

ICONOCLAST: So ... How far

does that rabbit hole go? DR. REYNOLDS: (Laughing) It goes very far. But, first, 9/11 is the lynchpin event of this century. We have to bring the movement to a boil so we can prosecute the real perpetrators. Once this opens up, it'll open up a whole raft of things ... It will go very deep and very wide. Once the American public is really awakened, and it is happening week by week, this could lead, ultimately, to the paymasters, the so-called invisible government ... But we're not ready to go there just yet. We've got to crack 9/11. That's the kev. People who just want to try to oppose the war in Iraq, or be supportive of the Israelis in Lebanon, or try to stop them [the Bushes] piecemeal are going to fail. None of this could be happening without 9/11. We've got to break 9/11 open for this movement to go further. I call it a constitutional crisis that we need to have. We need to go there.

ICONOCLAST: How do you go about shaking the foundations of government's story of 9/ 11 in the minds of others?

DR. REYNOLDS: Well, a lot of us [Scholars for 9/11 Truth] have worked on the physical evidence front, because it is a lot stronger than eyewitness testimony. So, for good or ill, a lot of us are pursuing this from a scientific standpoint. That may not make the best marketing, but I think we need this powerful evidence. Now, when it comes to convincing the American people and getting the word out, and educating, and using various types of persuasion ... We haven't gotten that far yet. But with the help of the Internet and the alternative media, we are making steady progress. Just not any great leaps yet. One way to approach somebody about this – and this is the approach my wife uses - is to just ask somebody out of the blue, 'Are you satisfied with the 9/11 story?' For a lot of people, it almost just begs to say, 'Well, no, I'm really not.

So, you ask what they find unsatisfying or suspicious. Now, when some people are confronted with this, they don't want to think about it. They don't want to look at this. They

want to shirk their duty as a citizen. So, maybe the nation can't be saved. But I'm not that pessimistic. If 90 percent of the public doesn't want to deal with the truth, deal with the facts, then the nation cannot be saved. I think it is only a small minority that doesn't want to deal with the facts. We have to go there. The truth is, to me, the most important thing. After 9/ 11, there is no more important issue in the world than 9/11. ICONOCLAST: Many people

will remember there was a 14month delay, getting the 9/11 Commission up and running. The Bush Administration kept stonewalling. Why?
DR. REYNOLDS: "They

didn't want, and they did avoid, an objective investigation of the facts, because it would lead right to the White House. They were forced by political pres-sure, especially by the Jersey Girls, to appoint such a commission. In normal circumstances, one would have been appointed or formed within a week. Any major event like this ... We find out what went wrong, and how to fix it. Their whole resistance to an investigation had to be modified. What they did, of course, is control the person-

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Zelikow. Thomas Keene ... As only a prosecutor would say, 'We're mobbed up.' There's no way they can serve on any kind of criminal justice forum. Even when Max Cleeland resigned, saying he didn't want to be part of a cover up, there was a lot of pressure to appoint Kristin Breitweiser, one of the four Jersey girls. But they didn't even do that. They appointed an experienced guy, Senator Bob Kerrey. So, they couldn't even let one outsider, a hopefully objective person, in on that. I mean, they appointed Henry Kissinger. (Laughs) But not even that made it in the mainstream, controlled media. They got a milder, cooperative-type set up. The idea of the government investigating its self objectively, I find, brings an even smaller chance of producing justice than any prosecution.


ICONOCLAST: What do you believe regarding the Pentagon? Was it a missile that hit it?

DR. REYNOLDS: Most likely. It was a cruise missile. I think. I mean, if you want to bust bunkers, which is what they're made for. They are sub-sonic, penetrating, explosive warheads. There are other theories that I would not reject offhand. It could have been an F-16. It could have been, and I don't believe this, but it could have been an AT Sky Warrior. There are others that believe it was an entirely internal explosion. On my website (nomoregames.net), I assembled the strongest evidence I feel proves that it was not a Boeing 757 that hit the Pentagon. The most recent development is that you couldn't, at 500 miles per hour plus, bring a plane in at the first floor. It is physically impossible.

ICONOCLAST: What about the light posts? Wouldn't a plane's wing get ripped off from hitting just one of those?

DR. REYNOLDS: Right. Yeah. As the movie Loose Change shows, there was a small, corporate aircraft that hit one light pole at Houston/Hobby and, um, it wrecked the plane. It was everywhere. People don't appreciate the difference between steel and aluminum. I mean, I went and weighed my sledgehammer. It is 9 ½ lbs. I could take that hammer and just wreak havoc on a 757's wing. I could whack a few panels off very easily. The fuselage is only two millimeters thick. It would not be difficult.

The point is, while the towers were definitely more hardened than the pentagon, the plane would just shatter; crumple.

There would be debris. I was talking on the radio to a woman just recently whose husband was witness to a plane crash out at JFK. You can't imagine what a mess ... There are people, there's limbs, there's blood, there's millions of pieces of metal and debris. A big, big field of stuff, everywhere. So, this idea that a big jet liner vanished into the pentagon is a big nonstarter. It is totally laughable.

ICONOCLAST: Wasn't part of the official explanation that the debris from the jet 'disintegrated' in the ensuing fires?

DR. REYNOLDS: They had different defenses, including vaporization, which could never happen. Couldn't happen, physically. Some people believe the wings folded up and allowed the plane to enter a hole, which is also rubbish, physically. The plane did not leave a scar on the building where the wings would have been, period. If I put my arms out, and come walking toward you at a fairly fast pace, and then bump into you, my arms move forward. (Laughs) Just simple physics! This is 8th grade science, here! Then, you have these engines, with 50,000 pounds of thrust, driving these things into the building. And somehow they folded up and didn't impact the wall of that building? People need to do their homework on such an important issue.

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Peace Prize Winner Would 'Love To Kill' Bush

pressed her deep frustration with President George W. Bush last week in front of cheering schoolchildren in Brisbane, Australia.

"I have a very hard time with this word 'non-violence', because I don't believe that I am non-violent," said the 64-year-old Betty Williams. "Right now, I would love to kill George Bush."

Williams, who was awarded the prize 30 years ago for her work to end violence in Northern Ireland, spoke during the Earth Dialogues forum at Brisbane City Hall on the deaths of innocent children during wartime.

"I don't know how I ever got a Nobel Peace Prize, because when I see children die the anger in me is just beyond belief,"

BRISBANE, Australia — A the Australian newspaper Nobel Peace Prize winner exquoted her as saying. "It's our

duty as human beings, whatever age we are, to become the protectors of human life."

Williams continued to explain that during a recent trip to Iraq, a doctor told her that he believed every single one of the 200 children he cared for there was going to die from cancers obtained from the

first Gulf War.

"[The children] needed five different kinds of medication to treat the cancers that the children had, and the embargoes laid on by the United States and the United Nations only allowed them three," said Williams, the head of the World Centres of Compassion for Children International, a non-profit that encouraged children to raise their



political voices.

Panel Says Earth's Temperature Hottest Ever In Past 400 Years

COLLEGE STATION — Con- steep rise in temperatures clusive evidence shows that Earth's temperature has risen over the past 400 years, and the last three decades have been the warmest period in history, a special scientific panel chaired by Texas A&M University professor Gerald North said in a report issued by the National Academy of Sciences.

"Our report states with virtual certainty that Earth's temperature has risen over the past 400 years," said North, the Distinguished Professor of Atmospheric Sciences at Texas A&M.

The panel concluded that the period from roughly 1500 to 1850 on Earth was a very cool time, known today as "the little Ice Age." The report also says the started about 100 years ago, and the last decades have been like no other time period found.

"Our report says with certainty that temperatures have climbed over the past 400 years, and the odds are very good that they have climbed even longer than that, probably for at least the past 1,000 years," North reported.

The report said that from between 1 A.D. and about 1850, volcanic eruptions and other events had the biggest effect on worldwide climate.

But temperature changes, the report said, "were much less pronounced than the warming due to greenhouse gas levels that have occurred since the mid-19th Century.



States Rejecting Abstinence-Only Sex-Ed Programs

from the Sexuality Information and Education Council of the U.S. (SIECUS) found that state and local communities are rejecting federal sexual education programs that teach abstinence-only.

"With no sound research and no support from the public health community, it is clear that citizens and policymakers in states and communities are deciding a better approach is needed," said William Smith, vice president for public policy at SIECUS.

Exxon Mobil Rakes In \$10.36 Billion **Last Quarter**

IRVING — The Irving, Texasbased Exxon Mobil Corp. announced a \$10.36 billion in earnings last quarter, fueling more political criticism in Washington for the world's largest oil company.

Through high oil prices, the company increased its revenue by 12 percent. If the revenue was any higher, Exxon Mobile would have broken its record profit \$10.71 billion set in the fourth quarter of 2005.

The \$4.9 billion of the earnings, Exxon Mobile said, went toward capital and exploration projects during the threemonth time frame. Shareholders received \$7.9 billion in dividends and share repurchases.

Over \$1 billion tax dollars have been allocated to abstinence only programs since 1998. The state of Texas received the lion's share in 2005 with \$16 million, followed by Florida with about \$12 million.

In its report, SIECUS found several states rejecting or criticized these programs in some way, including Maine, California, Pennsylvania, New Mexico, and Ohio, while others showed signs of moving in favor of more comprehensive sex education programs, such as New York and Illinois.

Still, crisis pregnancy centers and other anti-choice organizations continued to receive federal funding. In Massachusetts, the governor allocated dollars intended for advertising these states/index.html

sex-ed programs instead to a crisis pregnancy center already receiving \$1.5 million federal. New Jersey gives one-third of its federal funds to these centers and over 60 percent to antichoice groups.



In fact, here are some correctional corrections to a few gross misconceptions about the insanity defense.

Črazy murderers don't get a walk in Texas. The criminal court retains jurisdiction over the case for the max sentence that the law provides. That, in these cases, means life, since there is no cure for schizophrenia, and no judge is likely to risk re-election by cutting loose a child-murderer. Not even if she's cured as a side of bacon and holier than Swiss cheese.

· No murderer granted an insanity plea in Texas has ever left the hospital alive. Only since 1990 has the state provided the



indigent with psychiatric exams. If you were crazy and poor, criminal behavior constituted your third strike.

· There are five places in Texas where Andrea and Deanna could be locked up with any of a couple of thousand other psychopaths (try getting a good night's sleep with that little bedtime story ringing in your ears): Vernon, Big Spring, Kerrville, El Paso and the Daddy of Them All, RUSK. The East Texas facility has changed in recent years, but Satan once tried to rent it for the sixth level of hell. Guards were charged to shoot to kill any inmate who tried to flee. Until the mid-70s, no criminal or "forensic" inmate committed to Rusk was ever released. Not even non-lethal criminals. In the case of one Harry Reynolds back in the '70s, the high court ruled that Texas had to release those held beyond the maximum sentence if they were not considered a threat. We in Texas consider killing people somewhat threaten-

Further, the DSHS State **Hospital Forensic Admissions** Clearinghouse must first consider any release, which takes the hospital's mental health types out of the decision-making. The clearinghouse has a backlog, which is bureaucratese for "We'll get around to it some of these days." So even serving out the sentence doesn't guarantee a quick release.

· In 1999 only 16 percent of state hospitals' 2,278 beds were occupied by forensic commitments. Now it's about 30 percent. There are 642 available beds. Do the math; I'm tired. But 'crazy" and "overcrowded" don't usually play well together.

· In Texas the insanity defense is only tried in about one percent of the total criminal cases and only successful in a few more than a fourth of those (26 percent, if you really have to press the point). There's a good reason for that.

Texas' insanity defense is based on the McNaghton Standard with an inclination to the "irresistible impulse" test. In 1843 John McNaghton shot and killed Edward Drummond, the secretary to British Prime Minister Robert Peel. McNaghton, probably a paranoid schizophrenic, believed Mr. Peel was persecuting him. · Insanity examination of prisoners in Texas usually involves only two interviews, morning and afternoon, on a single day. The interview is not privileged, and any confession to the psychiatrist can be used against the defendant. Can't imagine why this defense isn't used more often! The evaluation is based on four issues: Is there a history of mental illness? Is this commensurate with the person's usual behavior? Is there an otherwise rational motive for the crime and did the person act crazy when interrogated?

With twilight nearing, the U.S. House of Representatives late last Friday night passed the first minimum wage increase in a decade.

But not until the House Republicans first poisoned the concoction with language to cut inheritance taxes on multimillion-dollar estates, which, when it all goes through the meat-grinder, results in a dilution of the purported increase of funds for the lower and middle income classes..

As it stands, the estate tax is set to be completely phased out by 2010, then jump to 55 percent on estates larger than \$1 million in 2011.

Strayhorn Predicts \$49 Million In Sales Tax Holiday Savings

AUSTIN-Texas Comptrol- and school uniforms, adults' ler Carole Keeton Strayhorn clothes and work uniforms, announced that Texas' annual opportunity to shop tax-free for clothes and shoes is coming up Friday through Sunday, Aug. 4-6. She predicted Texas families will save \$49 million in sales taxes during the eighth annual Sales Tax Holiday. The estimated savings include \$38.5 million in state sales tax and \$10.5 million in local sales taxes

"This tax break is real and it is available to everyone," Strayhorn said. "Families save about \$8 for every \$100 they spend on school clothes for the kids and new outfits for mom and dad."

During the Sales Tax Holiday, most clothing and footwear priced under \$100 are tax-free. Examples of items that can be purchased tax-free Aug. 4-6 include kids' clothes


shoes (including tennis shoes), socks, and underwear.

Items that cannot be purchased tax-free include handbags and wallets, jewelry, accessories, and athletic shoes, uniforms and safety gear. Backpacks and school supplies are not exempt from sales tax.

Shoppers saved an estimated \$47.4 million in state and local sales taxes during the 2005 Sales Tax Holiday. Since the first Sales Tax Holiday was implemented in 1999, taxpayers have saved \$287 million, including \$226 million in state sales tax and \$61 million in local sales taxes.



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
A Republican Woman Asks Why Democrats Do Not Demand Impeachment



The hysterical wife of an Oklahoma oilman called J. Edgar Hoover at home in the wee hours of July 23, 1933, to tell the FBI director that her husband had been kidnapped.

At that moment, the victim lay bound and blindfolded in the back seat of a sedan speeding toward the Red River. Even with no pursuers in sight, George "Machine Gun" Kelly kept the pedal to the metal. He could not wait to show his wife that for once he had done something right.

Following a short stretch in the New Mexico state prison, the small-time bootlegger came to Texas in 1927 to continue his nickel-and-dime career. Then one night in a Fort Worth honkytonk, he met the 23-year-old widow who changed his life.

By 1933 kidnapping was the latest underworld rage. Her appetite whetted by press accounts of six-figure payoffs, Kathryn browbeat George into snatching Charles F. Urschel, a wealthy Oklahoma City oilman.

The Urschels were playing cards with another couple on that summer evening, when two armed intruders suddenly appeared on the front porch. Unable to identify their target, George and crony Albert Bates forced both men into a waiting car and later dumped the extra hostage on the edge of town.

Four days later, Mrs. Urschel finally received instructions from the kidnappers. A family friend would board the express to Kansas City with a satchel containing \$200,000 in small bills. At the instant a second signal fire was sighted, he was supposed to toss the bag off the

Mrs. Urschel did her part, but George failed to light the fires on schedule and the courier car-

ried the money to the end of the Worth police led the FBI line. The ransom was eventually paid in broad daylight on a Kansas City street, but only after George promised that his prisoner would be home within 12 hours.

With the golden egg in hand, Kathryn ordered George to kill the goose. For the first time in their one-sided relationship, the hen-pecked husband defied the volatile vixen. George had given his word that Urschel would be released unharmed, and he intended to keep it.

Questioned at length by the FBI, the millionaire remembered that during his ordeal an airplane passed overhead twice a day at the same hour. Checking the regular flights over North Texas, agents deduced Urschel had been held somewhere in Wise County.

straight to the Shannon Ranch. Kathryn's mother and step-father were taken into custody and quickly spilled the beans to save their own necks.

The September 1933 capture of George and Kathryn in Memphis, Tenn., became part of FBI folklore. Hoover himself wrote, "As the FBI agents and local police surrounded the house and entered, one of them called out, 'We are Federal officers. Come out with your hands up.' 'Machine Gun' Kelly's hands were trembling as he reached for the ceiling. 'Don't shoot, Gmen! Don't shoot!"

A dramatically different version of the arrest appeared in a national magazine. A Memphis cop claimed he got the drop on George, who surrendered as he Information supplied by Fort quietly said, "I've been waiting for you."

In addition to George and Kathryn Kelly, the Shannons and Allen Bates, all sentenced to life terms, 17 other defendants wound up behind bars for the sensational kidnapping. The last to be turned loose in 1958, Kathryn vanished without a trace.

Pathetic George, the perpetual patsy, served his full sentence. Shortly before his death in Alcatraz, the broken-down bad man wrote a letter to Charles Urschel. "These five words are written on the wall of my cell. Nothing can be worth this!'

Since there's been no rain and it was beginning to burn up, we baled the second cutting of Sudan hay. We were lucky the first time to get as many bales as we did. The hay seemed really thick, different than in times war. It's very frustrating.

of normal rainfall. The bales were also very tight. Plus the guy who does this for us has a nice, shiny new baler that must work a bit differently than the one he's used for the last decade or so. We were lucky with the second cutting to get a few more bales.

For some unknown reason, for the first time in history, the hay bales are too heavy for our little, old tractor to pick up. This has absolutely never happened before. They can't be wet. There isn't anything in Central Texas that isn't bone dry right now. We can't move them anywhere. This means we actually got lucky enough in drought conditions to have some hay bales --and now we won't be able to feed them to the cows this winter because we can't pick them up to move them. Do you realize how ironic this whole situation is? (—Might actually have to buy a new tractor. . .or a three-point hook-up and hay fork for the old Farmall M —or a hay buggy. —Might be no other choice. What a revolting development this is, as Chester A Rilev would have said.... Buying a tractor wasn't in the budget. . . . and this just after I lost my job of course, another snafu.

Ever since we got high speed Internet through the phone company, I can't understand anyone on any of our phones. At first we were convinced this was because I neglected to install filters on all the phones. Well, I didn't know. So we had to purchase a kazillion of them and now have all the requisite filters in place. We have a filter to connect to the Dish network. We have a filter for the computer, even for the answering machine, anywhere there's a phone line. We've done everything we were supposed to do to ensure success. I thought Zach would absolutely lose his mind without an old movie to salve the pain of all the other problems. There was no escapism available, a dire situ-

So we rented the movie I mentioned before, slid it in, and the DVD player insisted that there was no disk. Yes, there was! I placed it with my own two hands. I saw it there. No disk! No disk! There was no convincing the year-old machine (just out of warranty, of course) that there was indeed a disk in place and ready to roll. You simply cannot argue with these things. So we gave up, read, and went to sleep, movie unwatched. We purchased a new DVD player today (another unexpected expense. When it rains, it pours). And as I said, we finally watched the movie, the one that flashed from screen to screen, the one we couldn't follow, and paid for the privilege of keeping it the extra day, to add insult to injury. Somewhere in the back of my mind I wondered if I had forgotten to put filters on something. You don't want to know the hoops I had to jump through to change out the old DVD player for the new, the connections, the wires, the indecipherable instructions. the drawings that didn't jive with the equipment we actually own. As usual, it was a nightmare. As usual, Zach disappeared during this procedure. Two coming elections— Democrat Ned Lamont vs Democrat, Sen. Joe Lieberman, in the August primary and Democrat Diane Farrell vs Rep., Chris Shays ,in the November midterms—can be considered as referendums on President Bush and his policies.

It has failed to negotiate disputes between Israel and the Palistinians and hostilities between Israel and Lebanon seem beyond its power (or will) to neutralize. Sectarian violence in Iraq between Sunnis and Shiites could spread like wildfire across the entire region which could give rise to a generalized war. Criminal activity is also out of control.

Sheeplike and mulelike, both Sen. Lieberman and Rep. Shays continue to follow the administration in their support of a war that drains human and monetary resources on a daily basis. Additionally, Sen. Lieberman and Rep. Shays support virually every other failed policy fostered by the Bush administration.

Conversely, Mr.Lamont and Ms. Farrell have both stated among their concerns, diversely, energy independence, security from enemy attack, employment, reproductive freedom and reform of the health care system. Both are highly critical of the administration's conduct of the war in Iraq and how and why it was ever begun.

However, there is one contract that seriously affects every citizen and very few pay attention to it. It is the U.S. Constitution, a contract between our citizens and the federal government.

The President, Vice-President, all Members of Congress, Supreme Court Justices, Cabinet Secretaries, and others take an oath to abide by it—but few if any do.

High Gasoline Prices Send Americans To Public Transports

DALLAS — High gasoline prices are sending motorists to public transportation and city officials to invest in those same transport systems, according to transportation agencies last week.

The trend is being seen by a rise in the number of hits transit systems are experiencing on their websites, said a representative of the American Public Transport Association. Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) spokesman Morgan Lyons told Reuters that its website "spiked with the rises in gas prices."

Because of this rising interest in public transportation, several ballot initiatives to improve transit systems are sprouting all over the country, including Salt Lake City where a 65 percent of the public there want to approve a plan to raise \$900 million in taxes for more light rail tracks.

The U.S. Energy Information Administration said that the last time gasoline prices caused this kind of exodus was when Hurricane Katrina landed on U.S. soil last year. Since then, the average retail price for gasoline rose 71 cents.

APTA reported that the estimated savings for using public transportation is \$2.56 billion at current average prices for a gallon of regular.

Rice Returns To Middle East To Broker Cease-Fire

CRAWFORD — A week after Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice promised no U.S.-backed cease-fire agreement on her trip to Beirut, Lebanon, President George W. Bush ordered her to return to broker a deal that would end the three-weekold fight between the nation of Israel and the guerrilla wing of Hezbollah.

However, this past weekend she was headed back to the United States with no deal in hand, as fighting escalated.


"I have no interest in diplomacy for the sake of returning Lebanon and Israel to the status quo," she said, during the United States' first diplomatic gesture on the conflict. "Such a cease-fire would allow terrorists to launch attacks at the Bush administration had given actions and even provided time and terms of their choosing.

After meeting with British Prime Minister Tony Blair in the White House Friday, President Bush announced that he was sending Dr. Rice back for a second trip to the Middle East. He added that both leaders want a U.N. resolution ending the crisis by early this week and a multinational force in place. However, Blair and Bush

Iraq Denounces Israeli Attacks

In his speech before the U.S. Congress last Wednesday, the prime minister of Iraq made no mention of his week-old denouncement of Israel's disproportionate attacks on Lebanon, though he denounced acts of terrorism in general.

Prompting a few cold shoulders from congressmen, PM Nuri Kamal al-Maliki — whose political party is Shiite Muslim, the same ethnic group that controls the Iranian and Syrian gov-– also failed to ernments condemn Hezbollah militants for kidnaping two Israeli soldiers and demanding a prisoner exchange.

Israel has used this kidnaping as a pretext to inflict military action to its northern neighbor, although Israel and Hezbollah have performed such prisoner swaps in the past. Pundits have speculated that Iran and Syria Bush administration's bias to-

weapons to it.

Hezbollah has also supported the cause of Palestinians and its new ruling government Hamas, who in recent weeks have experienced an escalation in their conflict with Israel. Hamas, also labeled a terrorist organization by the U.S. government, and Hezbollah both were voted into power by their people in democratically held elections within the last year.

Fasting Activist Speaks Out

Medea Benjamin, co-founder of CODEPINK: Women for Peace and Global Exchange, disrupted al-Maliki's speech when he said that Iraqi's inkstained fingers evidenced their desire for democracy. From the gallery, she shouted, "Iraqis want the troops to leave, bring them home now! Listen to the Iraqis!"

Benjamin, 54, of San Francisco, was promptly arrested on her 23rd day of fasting for peace as part of a collective effort called the Troops Home FAST (www.troopshomefast.org).

Earlier, the Iraqi Prime Minister broke a promise to meet privately with Benjamin and Cindy Sheehan, the peace activist who camped near President Bush's ranch last year. The two activists has agreed to break their fast if the meeting happened.

Sen. Conrad Burns (R -Mont.) made no mention of Benjamin's First Amendment rights to the New York Times, but he did note that he respected al-Maliki's right to speak "in an environment which respects and reveres free speech in the United States, a right we hope will continue to gain progress throughout the Middle East."

Former counter-terrorism officials have said that the encouraged Hezbollah's recent wards crippling Hezbollah

may lead to more threats of Thursday that the Canadian terrorist attacks inside the United States.

Arab World Reacts

The 275-member Shiite-led Iraqi Parliament last Sunday unanimously called the Israeli acts "criminal aggression." Its stand reflects the fervor of Shiite citizens who protested in the streets of southern Iraq towns.
The so-called "Arab World,"

however, is not so unified being that it consists of various cultural, ethnic, and religious groups. Sunni Arabs and their governments have not taken a position on Lebanon either way because Iran's ties to the little country are so tight. Still, some critics of Hezbollah have proposed more partnerships in dealing with Israel and the United States.

Eighty-percent of Iraqis want the U.S. to set a timetable for its troop withdrawal, according to a recent World Public Poll.

Europe, Canada React

Calls for Britain to suspend arms exports to Israel erupted last week as internal documents were uncovered showing that arms sales to Israel doubled in 2005. The call also came amid a poll that found that 61 percent of Britons felt Israel's attacks were "disproportionate."

The pressure to freeze military exports was directed toward Prime Minister Tony Blair, whose relationship with the Bush administration is seen negatively by about twothirds of the British public, according to a Guardian/ICM poll Blair disregarded a cease-fire in the House of Commons the week prior.

In Spain, Prime Minister Jose Luis Rodriguez Zapatero accused Israel of excessive force in Lebanon. Zapatero, who at the time of his comments wore a Palestinian scarf during his meeting with young Socialists, later rejected claims that his critique was anti-Semitic.

Across the Atlantic in Canada. Prime Minister Stephen Harper reiterated that Hezbollah was responsible for waging war against Israel as he offered his empathy to families of four adults and four children killed along with 11 members of a Lebanese family last week.

Israeli Bomb Kills U.N. Observers

An Israeli bomb killed four United Nations observers on a U.N. post near Khiyam, Lebanon, last Tuesday. The four men were from Austria, Finland, Canada, and China.

The Ottawa Citizen reported

who died, Maj. Paeta Hess-von Kruedener, had sent emails over the previous nine days noting that Hezbollah fighters had used the post as a shield to protect themselves from enemy fire.

The emails apparently contradict claims from the U.N. that Hezbollah had not been in the area at all. However, U.N. officials are sticking to their story.

CNN reported that the observers, prior to their deaths had called the Israel military 10 times in six hours to stop the attacks in their immediate area. Each time, the Israeli liaison promised the bombing would cease.

China condemned the death of its U.N. peacekeeper. Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert expressed his regret to the act to U.N.Secretary-General Kofi Annan, who later issued a statement calling for a full investigation by the Israelis.

Performance Pressure

Inside Israel, Prime Minister Olmert has received mixed criticism of this military campaign against the Shia force and its leader, Hassan Nasrallah. If Israel were to not put a dent into Hezbollah, the ramifications could be disastrous, said Moshe Arens, a former Likud defense minister.

'This will be a disaster for Israel," he told the Ha'aretz newspaper. "Nasrallah will be seen as someone who fired thousands of katyushas at Israeli communities for weeks and came out unscathed."

In any event, Israel called up about 30,000 troops from reserve to train for duty last Thursday, but stopped short of expanding the campaign into Lebanon Friday. Israeli officials said that its military was given the green light to continue its campaign against Hezbollah, after a high-level conference in Rome on Wednesday; however, the European contingent, not the White House, urged the ceasefire there.

"Hezbollah attacked Israel. I know Hezbollah is connected to Iran," Bush said in Washington earlier in the week. "Now is the time for the world to confront this danger."

As of deadline, the Lebanese civilian death toll was estimated to be over 600. On the other side, over 50 Israelis are believed dead after three weeks of fighting.

According to records at the **Beirut Government University** Hospital, about 55 percent of casualties there are children under 15 years old.
